

**RESOLUTION
(NY Fayette I, LLC Project)**

A regular meeting of Seneca County Industrial Development Agency on
November 5, 2020, at 12:00 p.m. (noon).

The following resolution was duly offered and seconded, to wit:
Resolution No. 2020 – 19

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SENECA COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (THE "AGENCY") TO (i) UNDERTAKE A CERTAIN PROJECT (AS DEFINED BELOW) FOR THE BENEFIT OF NY FAYETTE I, LLC (THE "COMPANY"), (ii) NEGOTIATE, EXECUTE AND DELIVER A LEASE AGREEMENT, LEASEBACK AGREEMENT, AGENT AGREEMENT, PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAX AGREEMENT, AND RELATED DOCUMENTS, (iii) PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE COMPANY IN THE FORM OF (a) A SALES AND USE TAX EXEMPTION FOR PURCHASES AND RENTALS RELATED TO THE UNDERTAKING OF THE PROJECT, (b) A PARTIAL REAL PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT UNDER A PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAX AGREEMENT, AND (c) A MORTGAGE RECORDING TAX EXEMPTION FOR FINANCING RELATED TO THE PROJECT; AND (iv) EXECUTE A MORTGAGE AND RELATED DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, by Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, as amended, and Chapter 63 of the Laws of 1972 of the State of New York, as amended (hereinafter collectively called the "Act"), the SENECA COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (hereinafter, the "Agency") was created with the authority and power to own, lease and sell property for the purpose of, among other things, acquiring, constructing and equipping civic, industrial, manufacturing and commercial facilities as authorized by the Act; and

WHEREAS, **NY Fayette I, LLC**, a New York limited liability company, for itself or on behalf of an entity to be formed by it or on its behalf (the "Company") has submitted an application (the "Application"), a copy of which is on file with the Agency, requesting the Agency's assistance with respect to a certain project (the "Project") consisting of: (i) the acquisition of a leasehold interest in certain real property located at 2497 Canoga Road, Town of Fayette, Seneca County, New York (the "Land"), (ii) the construction on the Land of solar modules and supportive racking, inverters, transformers and associated wiring and other components necessary for the generation of approximately five MWac of electricity for interconnection with the existing NYSEG electric grid, with related amenities (collectively, the "Improvements"), and (iii) the acquisition and installation by the Company in and around the Improvements of certain items of equipment and other tangible personal property (the "Equipment" and, collectively with the Land and the Improvements, the "Facility"); and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted on October 1, 2020 (the "Inducement Resolution"), the Agency (i) accepted the Application, (ii) directed that a public hearing be held pursuant to

General Municipal Law section 859-a; and (iii) approved financial assistance for the Project in the form of a sales and use tax exemption for purchases and rentals related to the undertaking of the Project, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agent Agreement (as defined in the Inducement Resolution), the total value of the exemption not to exceed \$100,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law section 859-a, on October 21, 2020, at 2:00 p.m. the Agency held a public hearing with respect to the Project and the proposed Financial Assistance (as defined in the Inducement Resolution) being contemplated by the Agency (the “Public Hearing”) whereat interested parties were provided a reasonable opportunity, both orally and in writing, to present their views; and

WHEREAS, copies of the minutes of the Public Hearing, written submissions and the notice of the Public Hearing published and forwarded to the affected taxing jurisdictions at least then (10) days prior to said Public Hearing are attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has prepared a cost-benefit analysis with respect to the Project and the contemplated Financial Assistance and has reviewed the results of said cost-benefit analysis; and

WHEREAS, in reviewing the Application, the Agency has considered (i) the nature of the Project, (ii) the economic condition of the area and the multiplying effect the Project will have on the area; (iii) the extent to which the Project will create permanent, private sector jobs and/or construction jobs; (iv) the estimated value of tax exemptions contemplated to be provided; (v) the economic impact of the Project and proposed tax exemptions on affected taxing jurisdictions; (vi) the impact of the Project on existing and proposed businesses and economic development projects in the vicinity of the Project; (vii) the amount of private sector investment likely to be generated by the Project; (viii) the extent to which the Project will require the provision of additional services; (ix) the extent to which the Project will provide additional sources of revenue for the municipalities and school district in which the Project is located; and (ix) the benefit of the Project not otherwise available to the area in which the Project is located; and

WHEREAS, the Agency desires to adopt a resolution (i) acknowledging that the Public Hearing was held in compliance with the Act, (ii) authorizing Financial Assistance to the Company in excess of \$100,000, (iii) authorizing the execution and delivery of the Lease Agreement, the Leaseback Agreement, the Agent Agreement, the PILOT Agreement (as all of the foregoing are defined in the Inducement Resolution) and all documents related thereto (collectively, the “Transaction Documents”), and (iv) authorizing the execution and delivery of one or more mortgages and related documents related to the financing of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Agency hereby finds and determines:

(a) By virtue of the Act, the Agency has been vested with all powers necessary and convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of the Act and to exercise all powers granted to it under the Act; and

(b) The Project will promote employment opportunities and prevent economic deterioration in Seneca County, and otherwise further the purposes of the Agency, and that by entering into the PILOT Agreement and otherwise providing financial assistance for the Project the Agency will be increasing employment opportunities in Seneca County and otherwise furthering the purposes of the Act; and

(c) The Facility constitutes a commercial facility as contemplated by the Act, and a “project” as such term is defined in the Act; and

(d) The leasing of the Facility from and the subleasing back of the Facility to the Company will promote and maintain job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the citizens of the County of Seneca and State of New York and improve their standard of living and thereby serve the public purposes of the Act; and

(e) Based upon the representations and warranties of the Company, the Facility conforms with local zoning laws and planning regulations of the County of Seneca and all regional and local land use plans for the area in which the Facility is located; and

(f) Based upon the representations and warranties of the Company, the Facility and the operations conducted thereon will not cause or result in the violation of the health, labor or other laws of the United States of America, the State of New York or the County of Seneca; and

(g) It is desirable and in the public interest for the Agency to acquire an interest in the Facility; and

(h) The Lease Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Company leases the Facility to the Agency; and

(i) The Leaseback Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency subleases the Facility back to the Company; and

(j) The PILOT Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency and the Company set forth the terms and conditions of their agreement regarding the Company’s payment of payments in lieu of real property taxes; and

(k) The Agent Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency and the Company set forth the terms and conditions of their agreement regarding the Agency’s appointment of the Company as its agent for the Project; and

(l) The Public Hearing held by the Agency on October 21, 2020 concerning the Project and the Financial Assistance was duly held in accordance with the Act, including but not limited to the giving of at least ten (10) days published notice of the Public Hearing (such notice also provided to the Chief Executive Officer of each affected tax jurisdiction), affording interested parties a reasonable opportunity, both orally and in writing, to present their views with respect to the Project.

Section 2. In consequence of the foregoing, the Agency hereby determines to (a) acquire a leasehold interest in the facility pursuant to the Lease Agreement, (b) sublease the Facility back to the Company pursuant to the Leaseback Agreement, (c) authorize the undertaking of the Project and appoint the Company as its agent for purposes of acquiring, constructing and/or equipping the Facility, subject to the Company entering into the Agent Agreement, and (d) provide financial assistance for the Project in the form of (i) a sales and use tax exemption for purchases and rentals related to the undertaking of the Project, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agent Agreement, the total value of the exemption (including the exemption approved with the Inducement Resolution) not to exceed \$476,812, (ii) a partial real property tax abatement, subject to the terms and conditions of the PILOT Agreement, and (iii) a mortgage recording tax exemption for financing related to the Project.

Section 3. The foregoing resolutions notwithstanding, the Agency's appointment of the Company as its agent for purposes of undertaking the Project is subject to and conditioned upon the Company's agreement, in accordance with Section 875(3) of the New York General Municipal Law, that, if the Company receives New York State and local sales and use tax exemption benefits ("sales and use tax exemption benefits") from the Agency, and it is determined that: (i) the Company is not entitled to the sales and use tax exemption benefits; (ii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are in excess of the amounts authorized by the Agency to be taken by the Company; (iii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are for property or services not authorized by the Agency as part of the Project; or (iv) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are taken in cases where the Company fails to comply with a material term or condition to use property or services in the manner approved by the Agency in connection with the Project, then the Company will (A) cooperate with the Agency in its efforts to recover or recapture any sales and use tax exemption benefits, and (B) promptly pay over any such amounts to the Agency that the Agency demands in connection therewith, and that in the event that the Company fails to pay over such amounts to the Agency, the New York State Tax Commissioner may assess and determine New York State and local sales and use taxes due from the Company, together with any relevant penalties and interest due on such amounts.

Section 4. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or the Executive Director of the Agency are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver the Transaction Documents in substantially the forms presented to this meeting, and all documents related thereto, with such additions, changes, variations, omissions and insertions as the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director, shall approve, which agreements may provide for the forfeiture and/or recapture of financial assistance where projected employment goals have not been met. The execution thereof by the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency shall constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

Section 5. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver any mortgage, assignment of leases and rents, security agreement, UCC-1 Financing Statements and all documents reasonably contemplated by these resolutions and required by any lender or financial institution identified by the Company providing financing for the Project, all with such

changes, variations, omissions and insertions as the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency shall approve, the execution thereof by the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval, provided in all events recourse against the Agency is limited to the Agency's interest in the Project.

Section 6. The officers, employees and agents of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the Agency to do all acts and things required to execute and deliver all such certificates, instruments and documents, to pay all such fees, charges and expenses and to do all such further acts and things as may be necessary or, in the opinion of the officer, employee or agent acting, desirable and proper to effect the purposes of the foregoing resolutions and to cause compliance by the Agency with all of the terms, covenants and provisions of the documents executed for and on behalf of the Agency.

Section 7. These Resolutions shall take effect immediately.


Marie Smithgall emailed her comments to staff prior to the meeting and they are attached and made a part of these minutes. She read her emailed comments in their entirety during the hearing:

Dan Compitello from Delaware River Solar expressed that most of the labor for this project is local to Seneca County and surrounding counties. He also noted that DRS is based in NYS and makes it a practice to hire local labor for all their projects.

A comment was received by email from Mr. and Mrs. Brent Murray of the Town of Fayette. Their email is attached and made a part of these minutes and was read at the hearing by Ms. Davis in its entirety.

To the Seneca County IDA Executive Director, Sarah Davis, and the IDA Board:

I had an opportunity to view the October 1, 2020 live stream of the IDA meeting and I wanted to thank the Board for the great discussion about job creation relative to the new Fayette Solar Project. The discussion seemed creative, heartfelt, and sincere with an intent to come to a resolution. It spoke volumes to the character of the Board members.

If I may offer a few points of consideration, I would humbly ask the Seneca County IDA Board to consider expanding the concept of "job creation", not only for long-term jobs, but to consider "construction jobs" and "local labor" as well. It is my understanding that the Seneca County IDA's mission statement is to promote incentives to businesses that will create good long-term jobs for the area. However, with the Fayette Solar Project it was brought to the attention of the Board that there would be very few long-term jobs created by this project.

It has been my experience through the solar projects that I have studied over the past several years, that many of the companies travel to New York State from out of state, and bring most, if not all, of their construction work force with them. This implies that workers travel from Texas, North and South Carolina, Georgia and surrounding states earning wages here, that are then sent back to their home states and promote economic growth there. Granted there is local economic growth seen through the utilization of local restaurants, hotel, and stores, but relative to the project cost they can be minimal.

I would encourage the Board, like neighboring counties to Seneca County have already enacted, is to not only consider "construction jobs" created but also to encourage Delaware River Solar to utilize local labor. Adjoining counties to Seneca encourage percentage requirements for workers to reside within Seneca County, in counties that boarder Seneca County, and then those workers and companies that have domicile within New York State.

I hope that the Board finds this information helpful if not for this solar project, or any project for that matter, may it consider it for the next.
